

# Planning for College Costs

Your financial aid estimated Cost of Attendance (COA) is calculated each award period (fall/spring and summer). The COA is the maximum financial aid available to assist you with educational expenses each term. Actual costs will vary depending on the following: number of actual credit hours taken, degree plan, residency (Texas resident or out-of-state resident), room and board choices, and personal expenses.
