## SECTION IV: DAVID J. EWING SCHOLARSHIP CRITERIA

## <u>DEADLINE</u>: Completed applications with required supplemental documentation must be received by UNT Student Financial Aid & Scholarships by 5:00 p.m., March 1, 2021 in order to be considered.

- 1. Applicants must attend an accredited institution of higher education.
- 2. Applicants must meet the minimum entrance and continuing academic performance standards of the higher education institution he/she is attending.
- 3. Applicants must be classified as an undergraduate student in one of the degree programs offered by the institution (freshman and sophomore students may enroll as "undecided majors").
- 4. Applicants must maintain full-time enrollment unless the student is nearing completion of his/her degree and has less than 24 semester hours remaining in his/her degree plan.

Note: Scholarship recipients must complete an appeal for less than full-time enrollment

- 5. Applicants must submit the following with their completed application:
  - a) official high school or college transcripts (including all transfer hours),
  - b) two letters of professional recommendation from teachers or employers who are non-family members,
  - c) an essay discussing your professional goals and need for a scholarship (two-page maximum, typed, double-spaced),
  - d) a copy of the death certificate and/or obituary, and
  - e) a copy of your 2021-2022 FAFSA Student Aid Report (SAR), <a href="www.fafsa.gov">www.fafsa.gov</a>, showing your official EFC and responses to dependency questions. The 2021-2022 FAFSA is available October 1, 2020.
